

2023 Project Selection Charter

1. Mission of the Nexans Foundation

The Nexans Corporate Foundation aims to:

- to support sustainable electrification projects aimed at helping to reduce energy insecurity and poverty in the world
- promote training and education of populations in technical, energy and environmental fields
- support environmental projects (climate, energy sobriety, protection of resources and biodiversity, etc.) in connection with electrification issues.

2. Calendar

A call for projects is organized every year at the beginning of the year.

3. Support

The Nexans Foundation will provide financial support to the selected projects.

4. Selection and Evaluation Committee

At the end of the annual call for projects, the Selection and Evaluation Committee proposes to the Board of Directors a selection of projects in line with the mission of the Nexans Foundation.

5. The main selection criteria

- The project must be exclusively in line with the Foundation's corporate mission.
- The project must be based on an analysis of locally expressed needs in the field.

- Project impact measurements will be based on social, economic and environmental indicators, which will be predefined, relevant to the project purpose and monitored over time.
- The project must involve the beneficiaries, in a logic of partnership
- The project must comply with NEXANS' Code of Ethics and Business Conduct.
- The project should make it possible to federate the initiatives of the sites and employees of the Nexans Group.

Countries eligible for the call for projects:

South America (Chile, Peru, Brazil, Colombia)

Africa (Morocco, Ghana, Ivory Coast, Senegal, Benin, Togo, Niger, Gabon, Senegal, Cameroon)

Near and Middle East (Turkey, Lebanon)

Asia Pacific (Australia, New Zealand, Fiji Island, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Cook Islands, Indonesia, Korea, China)

North America (Canada, USA)

Europe (France, Ukraine)

6. Eligibility of project leaders

The call for projects is addressed to international NGOs or recognized associations (i.e.: law 1901 in France).

7. The application file

The file must be written in French or English according to the form available on the Foundation's website: https://projets.fondationnexans.com/en/

8. The terms of the partnership

At the end of the Board of Directors meeting, the associations whose projects have been selected will receive a proposal for an agreement setting out the terms and conditions of the partnership: reciprocal commitments, allocated budget, duration of support, jointly decided communication actions.

The reporting procedures, the frequency of meetings and the indicators for monitoring and measuring impact will be defined between the Foundation and its partner at the start of the partnership and will be subject to regular reviews as the project progresses.
